



MEDICAL DEVICE DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM

Project X delivers medical devices to patients who are in need in distressed communities. These devices are outfitted with microchips that allow the clinical data to be transmitted to a HIPAA-Compliant Portal where their physician can review the information. What this makes available in these communities are:

- Patient awareness of medical issues in a timely manner
- Patient participation in improving personal health outcomes
- Physician access to clinical data within 10 minutes of measurements taken
- Electronic tools to alert patient/physician of adverse events and general reminders
- Data transmission over a cellular network allowing readings to be taken in most places

These devices are distributed to these patients based on a number of factors:

- Medicare Remote Patient Monitoring Program
- Other Insurance Providers Patient Monitor Programs (if available)
- Uninsured Patient Programs

Patients who fall under the Medicare RPM program will be provided the devices and Medicare will be billed accordingly for the devices, 20 minute physician monitoring and 30 day continuous monitoring. This billing will occur via participating physician and company doing the 30 day monitoring.

Patients who are underinsured or have no insurance will be provided devices based on the availability of grants and donations from interested parties. These grants will cover the devices, the 20 minute physician monitoring and the 30 days monitoring of the clinical data. It is our desire to see every person in distressed communities armed with the necessary modern tools to assist in improving their health outcomes while actively engaging them to be an active participant in this process.
